


Fig.1. Percentage of responses on how well the teachers prepare for the classes




Fig.2. Percentage of responses on how well the teachers able to communicate




Fig.3. Percentage of responses on approach of teachers to teaching




Fig.4. Percentage of responses on Fairness of Internal evaluation process by the teachers




Fig.5. Percentage of responses on performance in assignments discussed with the students




Fig.6. Percentage of responses on the interest of institute in promoting internship, student exchange, and field visit opportunities for students




Fig.7. Percentage of responses on the affect of teaching and mentoring process in the institution in cognitive, social and emotional growth of students




Fig.8. Percentage of responses on the institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow




Fig.9. Percentage of responses on the expected competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes of students informed by the teachers




Fig.10. Percentage of responses on the necessary follow-up by the mentor with an assigned task given to the students




Fig.11. Percentage of responses on Identification of students' strengths and encouraging them with right level of challenge by the teachers




Fig.12. Percentage of responses on the teachers' ablity to identify weaknesses of students and help them to overcome




Fig.13. Percentage of responses on the institution's effort to engage students in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching learning process




Fig.14. Percentage of responses on centric methods used by the institution for enhancing learning experiences




Fig.15. Percentage of responses on encouraging students to participate in extracurricular activities




Fig.16. Percentage of responses on the Efforts made by the institute/teachers to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills in students




Fig.17. Percentage of responses on teachers using ICT tools such as LCD projector, Multimedia, etc while teaching




Fig.18. Percentage of responses on the Goodness of the overall quality of teaching-learning process in the institute
