Plant distribution: It is native to South East Asia and Australia. In India, it grows in Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Sikkim, Bihar, Odisha, Maharashtra and Tamil Nadu.

Gardening notes:

- 1. It requires full sun or partial shade and any well-drained soil.
- 2. Plants are very frost-sensitive.
- 3. Propagation: By seeds and semi-ripe cuttings.



Economic importance:

- 1. Leaves are boiled in oil and applied on wounds and bruises.
- 2. Latex and fruit extract are used to treat inflammation, piles, leprosy and vomiting.
- 3. Leaves and twigs are used as insecticides or insect repellant.
- 4. It is ideal avenue tree for parks and gardens.

Plant description: It is a medium sized evergreen tree, with drooping graceful branchlets.

Root- Tap root and branched; Stem- Aerial, erect, woody, cylindrical, bark brownish black, smooth.

Leaf- Simple, alternate, elliptic to obovate, apex apiculate, base cuneate or obtuse, margins entire, dark green, leathery, slender petiole.

Inflorescence- Hypanthodium;

Fruit- Figs yellow, hard when immature.
